Let's take a brief look back: In February 2008, we established our school in small rented spaces with a group of just ten children. In 2009, we purchased our own property with the help of the *Preserve Slovenia — Help India* action project, whose instigator and sponsor was Ms. Romana Jordan. We began with the construction of our new school building in November 2012 and celebrated the

opening of the ground floor - which we've since already been able to move into - in February 2014. We then continued with the construction of the upper floor, the opening of which we celebrated during these last few weeks. The entire school building was constructed with donations granted to us by the German CED Foundation – which made us all the happier that they were able to join us for the



celebration of our final opening.



Our friends from CED – Fuat, Kerstin and Petra, spent intensive school days with us in the classroom as well as at the homes of our students. Despite the high temperatures that hovered over 40 degrees Celsius, we remained in great spirits and spent a wonderful time together.

This year, we also received a visit from the Lucia family, who made a special donation to our school in memory of their deceased sister and aunt, Maria Elena Alessandrini. In gratitude, we named the multi-purpose hall on the upper floor in her honour.
