characters with the help of children.





Bicevje Primary School from Ljubljana organized a wonderful humanitarian event called "FOR YOU, FOR ME, FOR THE WORLD", where donations were collected to help children of our school in India. The event was also attended by the President of the Humanitarian Society, Klemen Tomsic, the Ambassador Blanka Jamnisek and Dr. Anica Kos Mikus, the president of the Slovene Philanthropy. A special surprise of the evening were singers Murat and Jose with their rap song "From the People for the People", whose lyrics reminded us about the situation in society and encouraged the need for mutual respect.

2. Events at school




Children from <u>A.T. Linhart Primary School</u> prepared a nice surprise and sent us a large package of school stationery with letters and drawings, which made our girls especially happy.

<u>POTA volunteers</u> made the monsoon days look a little bit brighter. POTA is a programme of the Catholic Youth Community. The POTA programme has already been operating for 13 years to those young people in the summer months to volunteer

on projects around the world. One of them is also our school in Piali, where volunteers have been visiting us for many years. Volunteers along with the children do art and crafts, sing







They also teach children English, as well as about the world, especially about Slovenia and Germany, which are the countries where their sponsors are from. Together we explore the differences and similarities between cultures and customs, and we are realizing that we are connected by the desire for love, acceptance, mutual trust and friendship.



Every few months we organize a parent-teacher meeting, when we also invite one of the representatives of other non-governmental and state

organizations working on behalf of the village community.

This time we were visited by a representative of the local Health Center, where various medical help and counseling is provided to the villagers.

On August 15, we celebrated <u>Independence Day</u> like every year. Our girls, along with their teachers prepared a great program with singing, dancing, recitation and raising the flag. The children





danced in colourful costumes, traditional saris and Indian tunics.

Our upper hall was also in the rainy months full of the musical sounds of the traditional Bengal music, as well as of more modern sounds of Bollywood songs. We are thankful to Siddha Foundation for organizing small music concerts at our school.

We successfully continue with the <u>sewing and cosmetic</u> <u>courses</u>, which last for six months. Courses are mostly attended



by mothers who do not go to work, and also by students who

want to gain new skills. After completing the course, they continue to sew at home for their family and also for other customers, and with a cosmetic-hairdressing certificate they



can be employed in cosmetic and hairdressing salons, which are located in both towns and rural areas.
