Above all, we are creating a space where women can take a break from family responsibilities, encourage each other and chat a

little.

3. Girls attending English Medium School

We are very proud of the five girls who attend English Medium School, three girls have just entered tenth grade and two girls have entered eighth. These are the students who attended our school as little girls. They were with us from preschool to fourth grade. Because they had a high intrinsic motivation and an exceptional sense of English, their sponsors decided to support their schooling at English Medium School. Their advancement is а great achievement, as they come environment where no one speaks English.
